In more than 350 publications the all-round academic grappled not only with particle physics but also with questions of philosophy, theology, medicine and management doctrine. He advocates that people should come together again to create a whole out of the innumerable »me's«, which swirl around like the isolated atoms of an inert gas; colliding with each other every now and again but never coming into direct contact. A portrait of an enthusiastic scientist, pianist and Beethoven expert who made it his goal to make life better.
